Richard D. Fisco died peacefully on Friday, December 13, 2013 at HillHouse Assisted Living. He was born on April 7, 1920 in Brooklyn, New York, the son of Joseph and Mary (Pagonini) Fisco. He joined the army in 1939 and eventually served as the lead scout with the 509th Parachute Infantry Battalion and the 5th Army. Richard met and married his beloved wife, Louise Cechetti on December 8, 1944, the day of the Immaculate Conception, in the Church of Notre Dame in Nice, France. Richard joined the New York City Fire Department in 1949. He served as a Lieutenant firefighter for 20 years and retired in 1969. He traveled to France often with his wife and son, Richard. He was made an honorary citizen of Saint Tropez, France. Richard is the author of his autobiography "Our Lives Will Be Beautiful" published in 2011. Dick Fisco now rests with his wife for eternity in France. The Mass and burial were very simple, only 25 people attended, most were from the family side of Louise, His wife.

OPERATION ORDER 14-08

(Southern France 2014)

<u>Situation.</u> 15 AUG 2014 is the 70th Anniversary of Operation DRAGOON / RUGBY, the invasion and liberation of Southern France. America and France recognize the significance of this historic event in establishing a second front in France to rapidly bring about the destruction of the German war machine. As a result, France is conducting many celebrations and ceremonies to commemorate the historic event.

Areas of Interest: En Provence, Var, Alpes Maritimes, Nice, Cannes, St Tropez, LeMuy, LaMotte, LeMitan, Grasse, Draguignan, Trans en Provence, and Valbourges, France.

The 509th PIA conducts 70th Anniversary commemoration activities in Southern France on 08 – 17 AUG 2014 in conjunction with several allied organizations and the citizens of France to remember, honor, and serve the WWII Airborne Veterans, who participated in Operation DRAGOON / RUGBY.

Matt Anderson, our Webmaster and Board of Trustees member, is the Deputy Task Force Commander for this Operation, and is also an Instructor for the WWII Airborne Demonstration Team. The WWII Airborne Demonstration Team Foundation was formed to honor and serve the memory of the men who fought and died to preserve America's freedom during WWII. The activities of the Foundation recognize and honor all those who served and survived that conflict.

The Foundation serves that honorable purpose through the participation of its members in active parachute jumping in the style of the WWII airborne soldier, utilizing an aircraft that actually participated in the invasion of Europe. These activities serve to further the memory of their unbending loyalty to the cause of freedom.

Further, it is the goal of the Foundation to foster, promote and engage in research of WWII airborne operations and military history and to inform and educate the public through airborne operations and demonstrations throughout the United States and Europe.

From the pilots, who fly the WWII planes, to the instructors, cooks, carpenters, maintenance, etc., everyone volunteers their time to this endeavor. They hold jump schools twice a year, in the summer and winter. They are located in Frederick, OK, and their website address is: wwiiadt.org/

development, and war gaming strategies. At the conclusion of planning, the staff published an operations order. After receipt of this order, Geronimo Companies began executing the Troop Leading Procedures and readying the individual Paratroopers through pre combat checks and inspections. After a detailed Combined Arms Rehearsal and sustained airborne training, the Geronimo Battalion moved to the departure airfield in Alexandria, LA. Once at the departure airfield, Geronimo drew and donned parachutes Jumpmasters performed JMPI to inspect individual parachutes and combat loads. After commanders and leaders performed radio checks and finalized the plan, the first lift of Paratroopers boarded two C-130 Hercules aircraft. The first jumpers exited the aircraft at 2000 on December 11, 2013. Once on the ground, Paratroopers immediately put their weapons into operation, secured their air items, gathered their parachutes, and moved out to Company assembly areas. Leaders, meanwhile,

conducted radio checks with subordinate elements and higher headquarters in preparation for follow on operations. The Geronimo Battalion completed this exercise once all three lifts of Paratroopers had linked up in Company assembly areas, and all Companies were postured to conduct subsequent

What: Conduct Nighttime Tactical Airfield Seizure

As an Airborne battalion, Geronimo maintains the capability to conduct contingency operations Worldwide through Joint Forced Entry. Upon receipt of mission, Geronimo staff went into action and began planning using the Military Decision Making Process. This planning method incorporates the Commander's intent, intelligence assessments of enemy activity, course of action

What: Complete Yarborough Mile Competition

When: 6 January 2014 Where: Yarborough Mile Course

Why: To test individual Paratrooper physical fitness and build esprit de corps within platoon

<u>Summary of Training:</u> Paratroopers are asked to conduct some of the

most arduous and difficult missions assigned to our conventional land forces. Their only resources are what they can jump into combat, hump on their backs, or scrounge in enemy territory. They must be extremely physically fit, willing to push themselves to their limits, and be able to rely on the Paratrooper next to them. In accordance with this philosophy, Geronimo Soldiers compete in the Yarborough Mile biannually. Named in honor of LTG William Yarborough, the third Battalion Commander of 1-509th, the competition requires Geronimo teams to move several items of combat equipment through rugged and swampy terrain. In this years competition, Geronimo teams lugged a 55 gallon drum, six 5 gallon water cans, six replicated mortar rounds, two replicated AT4s, and one wooden ammo crate over the three mile course. The Battalion Commander, LTC Matthew Tackett, recognized the winning team in front of the Battalion at the completion of the event. For their demonstration of physical endurance and teamwork, the members of HHC/1-509th Team One were awarded the Battalion coin.

Commander's Notes:

The Yarborough Mile is a tradition within Geronimo that exemplifies the qualities of a Paratrooper. This event is another way that the Geronimo Soldiers continue to demonstrate they deserve recognition as elite members of the Airborne community.

3-509 IN (ABN) Squad PT Competition



Mission:

Companies provide 3 squads per company and an Ahkio group complete to participate in the BN Squad PT Competition

Key Points:

- Operating as a Squad in an Arctic environment completing 5 tasks comprised of 509 push-ups, 50 Ahkio squats, complete Ahkio set-up and tear down, 50 overhead Ahkio presses, and a 75m Ahkio carry.
- Learning about the effects of cold weather on operations and equipment
- Proficiency in setting up an Ahkio group to the NWTC and USARAK standard
- To increase Esprit DeCorps through a competitive event



<u>Task</u>: Conduct Squad Level/ Size competition to promote teamwork and Esprit DeCorps within the 3-509th BN <u>Conditions</u>: Given a Squad sized element and complete Ahkio system to complete the 5 events on the designated course <u>Standards</u>: Complete 5 events within the course in the shortest time possible

Lessons Learned:

•Leaders need to ensure that Soldiers are adhering to the standards for training in an Arctic environment
