Robert Maille Purple Heart Recipient; age DRACUT -- Mr. Robert J. Maille, age 90, a resident of Dracut, died on Friday, March 7, 2014. He was the husband of the late Doris T. 'Catin' (Casaubon) Maille who died on October 25, 2008.

Born in Lowell on December 24, 1923. he was one of nine children of the late Hector and Corinne (Lavoie) Maille.

Robert was a U.S. Army veteran of World War II, having served with Company A 509th Parachute Infantry Regiment. He was honorably discharged in September of 1945 receiving several medals including a Purple Heart.

Prior to his retirement, he was employed as a stone cutter at H.E. Fletchers Quarry in Westford for many years.

16 March 2014 70th Anniversary D-Day Ceremony Ellington Field, Houston, TX

A delegation from France was on hand to pay tribute to WWII veterans for their service in the liberation of France during D-Day, 6 June 1944. They made the trip since many of the veterans would not be able to attend the ceremonies this summer in Normandy. WWII 509'er John "Pappy" Devanie was one of the men recognized during the event. The honorees were presented medals & memorial vials with sand from Normandy Beach. The medals & vials were presented by Jean-Francois Le Grand (Honorary member of French Parliament & president of the county of the Manche, Normandy) & Marc Lefevre (Vice president of the county council of Sainte-Mere-Eglise). It was a fitting tribute to the men and women that participated in the historic events starting on 6 June 1944. John said he was excepting the honor on behalf of all 509 soldiers; past, present & future.

509th Parachute Infantry Association Reunion September 3-6, 2014 – Harrisburg East Holiday Inn, Harrisburg, PA

The registration fee includes CP room Wednesday – Saturday, September 3-6, 2014. In the CP room we will have our usual bar, sodas, coffee, decaf, hot water for tea and snacks. Your registration fee also includes a dinner banquet on Saturday night. Fee is \$110 per person.

On September 5th we will depart the Holiday Inn and head for Gettysburg where we will tour Gettysburg National Military Park Museum & Visitors center. The featured film "A New Birth of Freedom" will orient your group to the Battle of Gettysburg and the American Civil War. See the restored "battle of gettysburg" cyclorama painting, the largest painting in the country. Lunch will be at the historical Dobbin House. Four Score and Seven years before the Civil War Battle of Gettysburg, (1776), Reverend Alexander Dobbin built a house to begin a new life in America for himself and his family. Today his home, listed on the National Register of Historic Places, is a colonial restaurant where candlelit elegance, superior food in abundance, and gracious service brings back the sights, sounds and tastes of two centuries ago. It consistently wins Mobil Guide's highest area rating. The friendly hospitality of the Dobbin House extends to the Springhouse Tavern, Gettystown Bed and Breakfast, Country Curiosity Store, Abigail Adams Ballroom, in-house bakery and secret "underground railroad" slave hideout. Once we have finished our lunch we will take a guided tour of the battlefield. There will be up to 4 stops for you to take pictures. We are also working with the 509 paratroopers to have a jump at the drop zone near the battlefield. Fee is \$50 per person.

If you have not paid your Association dues and would like to take care of that now there is a place on the registration form to include your dues with your registration payment.
